A little History Part One— Plus Where we are now

History Part One

How far back do you think Keyworth Football Club goes? Go on, have a guess and let's see how close you are!

Keyworth Football Club was playing friendly matches as far back as 1876! The Nottingham Guardian reported on a game between Keyworth FC and Notts Pioneers FC at the Forest Grounds in Nottingham on the 12th February 1876, the Pioneers pipping the game 1-0. To put this into context, this was twelve years before the formation of the first football league by twelve clubs, including Notts County FC, and five years after the FA Cup was first introduced. This was also fourteen years away from the official recognition of professional footballers.

During the 1960's, football and cricket co-incided, with the majority of footballers also playing cricket causing a bit of a headache come the beginning/end of their prospective seasons. In the early years, it was often the case that the away team would arrive on horse drawn carts!

A variety of kit colours have been used over the years. Claret and Blue was the choice for the 1906/7 season. Blue shirts with a yellow V were used prior to the club becoming a Junior to Nottingham Forest FC and thus receiving red and white kits for the 1950/1 season. In the early 1960's this changed to blue and white striped kit and the green, white and black that you see today was adopted in 1976/7.

Of the clubs still in existence, the oldest is Radcliffe on Trent, who Keyworth first met in the Notts FA Junior Cup on 14th October 1893.

Keyworth moved around the village prior to just after World War two, playing on fields on Selby Lane, Wysall Lane, Bunny Lane and Nottingham Road before using the Rectory Field off Elm Avenue and then Platt Lane, where they are based today.

Keyworth football teams grow from strength to strength. The development of the footballers has kept a lot of players right through the age groups. Keyworth now boast an impressive fifty five teams this season with all ages catered for, with twelve of these being girls teams. The First Team, Reserves and Ladies (adult) team go without saying, who are supported by locals as well as friends and family. Platt Lane's great facilities has also been enhanced with the start of the art 3G pitch was opened in May 2021.

There are a mixture of age groups, from Under 18's right through to Under 8's, for both boys and girls teams. The toddlers are also catered for, with Wildcats being suitable for children from four years old. The mature adults are also welcome, with Keyworth having both walking mens and womens sessions. The welcoming nature of Platt Lane and the hard work, dedication and enthusiasm of all of our coaches provides an exciting and positive buzz at Platt Lane.

Today's visitors: Clifton All Whites FCB



Clifton All Whites were founded in 1963, originally named Thistledown Rovers. During the 1960's and 1970's Clifton All Whites dominated youth football by attracting the best players from all over the county.

By 1966 plans were underway for Clifton All Whites to test their skills abroad in a

tournament in the Netherlands, with overseas tours being rare. In the early days, football clubs only supplied shirts for players however Clifton All Whites set a standard by supplying the full kit. Clifton's under 12's also set a first, playing a Scottish team before a first division match between Nottingham Forest and Newcastle United, in front of a crowd of over 20,000!

Professional clubs attempted to persuade Clifton All Whites to be a nurse club however the club policy stands to not be tied to any one club. Clifton All Whites performed well in the FA Youth Club games and gained their own ground. In 1973 the club moved out of youth football into senior football and joined the Midland league. Mick Walker became the first club manager and coach, later becoming manager of Notts County. Clifton All Whites left the Midland league in 1977-78.

During the 1990's, Clifton All Whites played in the Nottinghamshire Alliance and later joined the Nottinghamshire Senior League. Clifton All Whites joined the Central Midlands League South Division in 2010 where they continue to play. Clifton won the South Division Championship in 2013-14. Clifton All Whites are thriving, with teams from Junior Soccer School and under 7's to seniors. The first girls' team was introduced in 1999.

Clifton All Whites has had a number of professional players play for them at one time or another. These include Garry Birtles and Jermaine Jenas, both of whom played for Nottingham Forest.
